

Gov't announces urbanization plan



Querétaro Gov. José Calzada Roviroso has announced the initiation of infrastructure works related to urbanization, subsoil

drainage, electricity and lighting, as well as the construction of a day center for the elderly in the towns of Jurica, Juriquilla and Pie de Gallo worth 120 million pesos (\$9.21 million).

Calzada Roviroso said that as a result of public tenders, young entrepreneurs from the Mexican Construction Chamber (CMIC) have been granted 17 contracts worth more than 50 million pesos which will fund their participation in carrying out the works.

"It gives us great pleasure to be able

to achieve progress while simultaneously providing opportunities for people," Calzada said.

He also said these works are some of the most important to be carried out in recent years.

Close to 85 million pesos will be invested in the improvement of the Paseo Camelinas road, widening it from 6.5 meters to 20 meters.

The funds will also be used to install sidewalks, drains and improved lighting.


Calzada highlighted joint efforts to provide water, electricity, and solid flooring to 100 percent of Querétaro families through the Solutions Program initiative.

"Prosperity begins with having a solid home that fulfills the basic elements of electricity, running water and solid

flooring," he added. "Our goal is alleviate the struggles of families so that they don't have to make extra sacrifices just to provide the bare minimum."

Also present during the announcement were the president of the state legislature, Braulio Guerra Urbiola; Secretary of Urban Development and Public Works Pío X Salgado Tovar; Secretary of Youth Mariana Ortiz Cabrera; a spokesperson from the State Water Commission (CEA), Habib Wejbe Moctezuma; the coordinator of the Solutions Program, Fausto Foyo Retana; state delegate from the Social Development Secretariat (Sedesol), Manuel Pozo Cabrera; Querétaro CMIC President Alejandro Cabrera Sigler; and representative from Young Entrepreneurs of CMIC, Jesús Salvador Hernández Frías.
